## Walk Instructions:

- 1. With Heigham Bridge behind you, and the restaurant on your left proceed ahead and join the cycle path and footpath which runs alongside the towards the river. road. Head towards the main road the A149; ignore the path leading
- At Low Road, turn right at the post box. Continue along this quiet lane Turn right, as the cycle and footpath crosses over the junction, before the main road, cross here with caution. Once on the other side join the footpath, which runs parallel with the road
- ယ after the footpath has ended.
- Soon you will come to a village bench on your right, directly opposite a on you right, the grassy track becomes much wider as it runs between towards a derelict farm building. After you have passed the farm building a meadow. At the junction continue straight ahead, follow a ridge of trees edge, passing a utility station. The footpath follows the hedgerow.
